

“Hugo Primozic Living the STUG LIFE”




Rzhev, Russia — September 15th, 1942

In the summer of 1942, the Soviets launched first Rzhev–Sychyovka offensive operation. The months long operation would begin in July and wind down by September. A notable action occurred on the 15th of September when the 2nd Battery of the Sturmgeschutzabteilung 667, led by Hugo Primozic took position to ambush a Soviet mixed force of T-34's and KV-1's with light infantry support. Primozic's three STUGS would position to take out the advancing armor, while local Grenadiers prepared to repel any Russian infantry.

VICTORY CONDITIONS: The Russian Player wins immediately upon knocking out all three STUG's or at game end by controlling Hexes G5 & J6. Any other result is a German victory.




Board Configuration:

Special Rules/Notes:

1. EC are Moderate with no Wind at start. Bore Sighting (C6.4) and Kindling (B25.11) are N.A
2. German Infantry may set up Entrenched (B27.11) in appropriate terrain.
3. German STUG's may reconceal after Turn 3, south of Row N and not in the LOS of any enemy unit.
4. After Turn 4, the German STUG's may voluntarily exit the south edge.

Aftermath: Primozic's STUG would be sighted by a lead T-34, which took a shot and missed. Primozic's gunner would fire and knock out the T-34. After several minutes, burning T-34's littered the front. As the Soviet armor began to respond to Primozic's platoon, the STUG's would quickly relocate aided by their low profiles and covering terrain. The Soviet advance would then blunder into another of Primozic's ambushes. By the end of the day, Primozic had knocked out 24 T-34's. He would earn the Knight's Cross on September 19th after destroying a total of 45 Soviet tanks during the previous days fighting.
